Impact

1. Quality and scope of PE lessons

Throughout 2017-18 we continue to employ a specialist Sports Coach to deliver high quality PE lessons to each of our 3 classes on a weekly basis. By employing a specialist coach are able to offer more choice of sports to our pupils – football, tag rugby, netball, cricket, basketball, rounders, curling, gymnastics and dodge ball. In having the coach work with us has also resulted in some very challenging and fun sports days. Our coach also continues to run two very successful extra-curricular clubs – After school 'Games Skills' and lunchtime football. Due to their popularity with pupils these are self-funding. Coaching is specifically used to further develop the skills of football and to enable a team to enter and do well in school competitions throughout the year.

2. Focus on the professional development of the staff

One of the key strands of the sports funding is to develop the confidence and skills of our school staff so that the quality of PE and sport that is delivered will be enhanced. We have continued to employ a qualified sports coach to work alongside the staff to deliver lessons and support the planning and delivery of PE. Coaching is delivered in partnership with the class teachers who use the opportunity to develop their own coaching and sporting knowledge. Working in this way teacher confidence and expertise is developing all the time.



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3. Specialist Dance Lessons

We continue to employ a specialist dance tutor to teach dance across the school year groups. The tutor brings with him a wealth of experience, professionalism, imagination and energy. He offers dance instruction, choreography and fun creative challenges in playing with movement. His range of contemporary dance styles are a wonderful way for the pupils to express themselves. The children are making huge progress and many are having the opportunity to perform at the Dance Arts Awards.

4. To further encourage competitive sport & team building across the school through House competitions/events

All children will be taking part in the school's annual sports day as well as a new 'sports challenge day' along with fellow pupils at The Hampstead Norreys Primary School. This will include activities such as rounders, cricket, boules, tennis, a penalty shoot-out and curling.



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
